# Transition (Pre-K)

## A FEARLESS START TO KINDERGARTEN

Wollondilly Anglican College's Transition Pre-Kindergarten program is specially designed to assist children to adapt to and learn the structures of schooling prior to starting Kindergarten. Our 2 or 3-day programs provide wonderful opportunities for your child to begin socialisation with a larger group of children and adults. The programs have greatly assisted our students in making a smooth and fearless start into full-time schooling in Kindergarten.

## WHY TRANSITION OVER DAYCARE?

Many Daycares will provide a level of education that is very much determined by their children's own interests and willingness to participate. Our programs take a more structured, although at the same time, gentle approach to learning. Children spend part of each day in structured learning situations where they are shown and helped to follow instructions and participate in a positive and helpful manner. These are essential skills that are used to help your child successfully transition into a normal school environment.

## WHAT DOES A NORMAL DAY LOOK LIKE FOR TRANSITION?

Each day starts with roll call and devotions, this also includes time for singing and dancing. A Phonics lesson is usually the first formal lesson of the day. Students will then have a 'Fruit Stop' that involves some free play and a snack of fruit to break up classroom time. Transition then also participate in a Mathematics lesson and a Literature lesson (Prelit) each day. During the week, each class will participate in group rotations, fine motor activities, Library lessons and PE lessons.

*\*Please note that your child must turn 4 years old by 31 March of the year of enrolment*







# The Primary Years

## RESILIENT & CONFIDENT LEARNERS

The Primary Years Program at Wollondilly Anglican College is designed to develop the skills and attitudes students need for a lifetime of learning, using an Explicit Instruction approach that focuses on building content knowledge that can be applied creatively to problem-solving and other situations. The program is based on the Science of Learning and takes into account Cognitive Load Theory.

**Students in the Primary Years are taught to be resilient, resourceful, reflective and relational Learners. Our aim is to see every child love learning and grow as an independent learner, understanding their own part in the process.**

## STUDENT WELLBEING

Students in the Primary Years remain with a single teacher for most of the day in purpose-built classrooms with ready access to age-specific Libraries. This learning environment allows for the class teacher to focus on individual student care, resilience building and fostering positive relationships. Educational opportunities include Weekly Sports, Creative & Performing Arts Programs, Chapel, fortnightly Care & Culture Programs and a regular Buddy Program.

Students are encouraged to serve each other, to be good friends, to participate in all activities to the best of their ability and to work together.



# The Secondary Years

The Secondary Years build upon the quality learning that has come before in Pre-Kindergarten to Year 6. Students are taught by specialist teachers, with each child being valued as an individual and encouraged to achieve their God-given potential. The Secondary Years Program challenges students to think deeply about the world in which they live and how they can be value-based and ethical contributors to it. Students are equipped with the ability to think critically and respond to challenges through the development of problem-solving skills.

A Wollondilly education seeks to give young people purpose in this world, equipping them with the capacity to think critically and problem-solve within a spirit of empathy and care for their fellow citizens. Skills necessary to thrive in society.
