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
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

### Begin with the End in Mind

### Dr Quarmby's Farewell Speech to the Students (Abridged Version Part 1)





The Anglican Church Cathedral in the Capital, Kota Kinabalu, was surrounded by a compound with razor wire on the fences and a guard at the gate with a machine-gun. The Cathedral is a signpost to a past where Christian Missionaries spread the news of the gospel freely. We visited the schools that had been set up by Christian Missionaries.

On the first morning after we had arrived, I was woken by the sound of children's voices. They were singing a song and even though I did not know the words, I knew the tune - "Jesus loves me this I know". It was coming from inside the compound and in a building near the church. I followed the noise to its source. It was a Pre-school - a Christian Pre-school. In the middle of a country where Jesus' name is not welcome from Kindergarten onwards, it was still okay in a Preschool.

I introduced myself to the teacher and she asked if I wanted to see the classrooms. The school was quite poor. As we walked along the corridor I asked her why each of the classrooms had a different English word written on the door. She told me that the word was the name of the class - so they could remember the name of their class and remember Jesus the rest of their life. The names of the classes at the Pre-school in Sabah were Faith, Hope, Joy, Peace and Grace.

We have had a saying to remember for each of our first 17 years. It appeared on the Waratah Weekly for that year. Names and sayings are powerful.

2003 - There is never a second chance to make a first impression. A story begins on the first page and it was important to start well.

### 2004 - Begin with the end in mind.

In our first full year we pictured what the College might look like in 2020 and we worked towards that vision.

### 2005 - Excellence is never an accident.

Excellence, Endurance, Eternity. As Christians we must strive to seek the best in ourselves to honour God and equally importantly, also encourage it in others.

### 2006 - You can't cross a chasm in two small jumps.

It was a year for big decisions and big commitments. It was a very expensive exercise to set up facilities to cover all electives for our first Year 9 and classes to follow. Whatever our challenge, God would be there.

### 2007 - There is no Victory without Honour.

In a year when the Melbourne Storm was stripped of all their premierships for cheating the salary cap we were reminded to examine our own lives and ask the question - What is a victory if God is not cheering with us?

### FROM THE INTERIM HEADMASTER

2008 - Failure is often the line of least persistence

The challenge of persistence reminds us of the second word in Excellence/Endurance/ Eternity - Endurance. Practice and commitment towards a task that was worthwhile produces Endurance. The testing of your faith produces Endurance and that Endurance leads to hope, which will never disappoint.

2009 - When your actions speak louder than words - don't interrupt. Presentation Nights have never been a list of all the things that we achieved in a year. We all know those things. Instead it has been an opportunity to thank God, to keep telling our history, to tell stories of things to come and to pray.

2010 - *In God we Trust*. These four words are written on the American One Dollar note to remind the people that God is the true source of their wealth and worship - not money. Maybe it would be better written on our hearts.

2011 - *Don't Fear Tomorrow* - God has already been there. God does not fear time. He invented it. We should not fear time either. Jesus freed us from it and gave us Eternity. Eternity is the final word too in Excellence/ Endurance/Eternity.

2012 - You'll Never Walk Alone. In a world where we are always connected and never alone, why are people so lonely. Walk with God and you will never walk alone. Follow His lead and you will never stray.

2013 - Choose to Listen and Believe the Voice of Truth. Last year we remembered to walk with God. This year we were reminded to listen and believe. The world will tell you that truth is relative and you can believe whatever you want. This is a lie. There is truth. It is found in Jesus. It is eternal.

2014 - You're a Shining Star No Matter Who You Are. God made you special. God loves you. God does not make junk. Find your gift and let it shine

### **Students Wearing Masks**

On Sunday, 2 August NSW Health issued an advice update on the use of masks. 'The NSW Government is strongly encouraging greater use of masks in high-risk public settings to help prevent the spread of COVID-19'.

At this stage there isn't specific advice for school settings regarding masks. The consistent advice has been that social distancing of children at schools is not required. Some parents may choose to provide their child with a mask as a precaution. The College is not mandating the use of masks.

It is important to remember that masks should be considered as a fourth line of defence alongside:

- Staying home when unwell and getting tested
- Physical distancing
- Good hand hygiene

If students wear non-disposable cloth masks, they need to be **one plain colour** rather than multi coloured, patterned or with an image. They would be worn for health concerns.

### **TEACHING AND LEARNING 7-12**

### Parent-Teacher Interviews Years 7-10

Just a brief reminder that our second set of Parent-Teacher interviews will occur next week on **Wednesday**, **12 August** from **3.00 pm - 8.00 pm**. Interviews are held by Zoom and Parents/Caregivers can elect time slots for each of their children's teachers.

The College already held the first set of interviews on Tuesday, 4 August, and we hope that you found it a productive and worthwhile experience to have conversations with the teachers of your child/children and used this opportunity to discuss some personal learning goals and focus areas for Semester 2.

Thank you to the parents and students who attended these first round of interviews and to Dr Eaton who has done a significant amount of work in getting these organised.

### Year 11 Student reflections and Interviews

Students in Year 11 recently completed a google form to assist them in evaluating their learning throughout their Year 11 courses so far. Self-regulation and reflection is part of the College's education framework goals and it has been helpful for students to reflect upon their studies.

Students are encouraged to think about their effort in the classroom for each of the subjects that they study, as well as the effort/amount of study in the subject they commit to in the home environment. They reflect upon academic achievement, study routines, the impact of part time work and identify areas that perhaps prevent them from achieving their personal best. Mr Burns and myself then use this self-reflection, and the student's report, to conduct personal interviews to identify individualised learning goals. Post school options also form an integral part of this conversation.

### **Elevate Education**

The College is looking forward to working with Elevate Education as they present two different study skill sessions at the College in the upcoming weeks. Sessions will occur at the College during normal College hours. Elevate Education will work with:

- All Year 7 students on Friday, 14 August: Year 7 will be focusing on time management. In this session they will learn about managing homework, assignment deadlines, preparing for exams and how to revise.
- All Year 9 students on Monday, 17 August: Year 9 will be focusing on study skills, summarising and formatting notes, preparing for exams and the importance of developing goals and strategies to achieve their personal best. Methods for managing stress and the importance of wellbeing.

We hope that not only will the students learn some important skills during these sessions but also they look to implement them into their daily routines to improve overall learning and achievement.

### PASTORAL CARE T-12

### Why the little things matter?

On the Secondary Assembly this week I was able to speak to Years 9 and 10 about a range of little things that are needed to maintain a positive tone and atmosphere at the College.

The presence of such areas maintains an atmosphere that is critical to the type of environment that the College has become well known for, and is a major reason why the College is held in high regard by our community. The absence of these things can be highly detrimental to the maintaining of our standards and certainly impacts on the tone and culture of our College.

The areas that were covered were as follows:

### Respect

Students were reminded that all interactions in the College, whether they be with staff, students or parents should be respectful, polite and cooperative. Students were reminded by the Student Wellbeing Prefects that they should demonstrate respect for themselves and for others. This should be present both in their day-to-day and on-line interactions.

### Pride in Belonging

Wear your uniform correctly and present yourself well. This is a reflection of your attitude, care and belonging to our College. Particularly from older students, the role modelling of this for younger students can be very positive and infectious.

### **Following College Procedures**

Keeping hands and feet to oneself can ensure that all students are safe and that interactions of a lower level do not escalate into more serious situations. Students instigating the signing of diaries by parents and parents checking and signing diaries is a small area that supports an ongoing partnership of communication between all parties here at the College, ensuring all are informed. Adhering to expectations around the use of mobile phones and ICT are further areas that support the culture of the College.

### Being organised and demonstrating application to learning

Ensuring students are prepared for all lessons with the correct equipment, demonstrating application to learning and completing and submitting homework and assessment tasks, support an expectation around coming to the College to learn and participate.

The above individually represent a collection of small things that if done consistently and maintained contribute to ensuring our College maintains a culture and tone that is positive.

### PASTORAL MATTERS - JUNIOR YEARS T-4

### **T-4 Semester 2 Pastoral Programs**

This semester we have two big initiatives happening during our fortnightly pastoral session.

### Years T-2: Fill My Bucket

Teaching children to be kind, considerate and understanding is something that develops over time. It is normal for children in the T-2 age group to be developing the ability to take on the perspectives of others, allowing them to see things from another student's point of view. Fill My Bucket is a program which has been used at the College previously for Transition and Kindergarten. This year we have extended it across Years T-2.

The program is focused on teaching children about kindness, self control, resilience and forgiveness and looking at ways they can encourage and build each other up. This is done through the use of a 'bucket' analogy. The bucket is representative of a child's mental and emotional health. You can't see the bucket, but it is there. Positive attention such as love, kindness, safety and care, nurturing, hugs and support are all experiences which fill a child's bucket.

In addition to feeling valued, children need to learn how to share these feelings with others. When children show they care about others in what they say and do, they not only fill the bucket of others, but fill their own buckets too. It is important to know we can fill our own buckets.

Years T-2 are looking for ways to fill each other's buckets by saying or doing nice things to the people around them. It's simple. When our buckets are full, we are happy. When they are empty we are sad. Buckets are emptied by bucket dippers who do not show kindness to others.

This program is a really effective way to get our younger students thinking about other people and how they can show kindness to each other. Please talk to your child about the program and encourage them to become a bucket filler.

### **Years 3-4: Servant Leadership**

Years 3-4, in line with the middle and senior pastoral care programs, are developing their understanding of servant leadership. Students spent time during last Monday's lesson understanding what a servant leader is, reflecting on different bible verses and looking at Jesus and the example he set during his time on earth.

As the term progresses students will identify different opportunities where they may be able to serve others at the College or in the local area.

### STAGE 3 PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT - HEALTH UNIT

This Term Stage 3 will participate in a short unit, which covers puberty and aspects of human reproduction.

The unit will be taught to groups of boys and girls separately. Female teachers will teach the girls and male teachers will teach the boys.

### Both groups will cover:

- Different body systems (briefly).
- Human reproductive system.
- Growth and change, specifically puberty.
- Personal hygiene, mental, social and physical health.
- Depending on time and the questions students have, the development of babies from conception to birth is usually covered.
- Please note, the content of this unit is general and focuses more on how their bodies will change rather than human reproduction, however aspects of human reproduction will be touched on. So too will matters of child protection, safety and responsibility. This is kept age appropriate along the lines of 'should someone touch you in a way you feel uncomfortable you should report this to....' and 'everyone should always respect others by not touching, hugging, kissing unless you are certain that the other person is okay with this, eg parents love a hug, however not all your friends want you to hug them.' Also, that it's ok to say no to someone who wants to hug, kiss, hold hands etc.'
- Greater age appropriate detail is covered as students go through secondary years.



Indoor sports, Volleyball, Basketball, Frisbee, Lacrosse, Team Games, Target Games and Bushwalking to name a few.



### **WASP Cross-Country**




